Cripple Creek.

Cripple Creek is the metropolis of the great mining district bearing its name. Eastern people are quite generally confused regarding the district and the city, and look upon it as one crude mining camp with "shacks" for buildings, occupied by men wearing candles in their hats and using miners' slang. A single visit is enough to convince the most skeptical that no eastern city has handsomer business blocks, finer or better stocked stores or more convenient residence buildings than the city of Cripple Creek, while its people are the choicest and most cultured selection from all parts of the United States as well as foreign countries—people who have had the enterprise and "sand" to build themselves homes and fortunes in the new west.

Prior to the spring of 1890 there were only an occasional prospector and the few cattle men who inhabited this country to disturb the quiet of this great district, where now are nearly thirty-five thousand industrious and thrifty people.

The city of Cripple Creek has grown and prospered from the beginning, but not without serious setbacks. First came the great boom when gold was discovered, followed by the natural reaction when it was found that nuggets and dust could not be picked up in the street. Then came a period of quiet time while a few mines were being developed, followed by a great rush of people as the output of ore began. In 1896 came the two great fires, with less than thirty days between, practically destroying the town and financially ruining many of the best business people. The rebuilding period was followed by a reaction and it was thought by many that Cripple Creek had seen its best days, but the mines continued to produce and the city grew. Just at present another depression is on because of the departure of surplus labor, speculators and a large floating population which has never been of value to the city. Good business men recognize the fact that this depression can last but a short time and the city will then be in better condition than ever before.

Cripple Creek is the county seat of Teller county, has three railroads, the most remarkable electric railway system in the world, excellent schools, many fine churches, good police and fire protection, an excellent water system and in fact everything to make residence desirable.
